POPE FRANCIS MOURNS DEATH OF QUEEN ELIZABETH II AND SENDS BLESSING TO KING CHARLES III

Pope Francis mourned the death of Queen Elizabeth II, praising her "steadfast witness of faith in Jesus Christ" in a telegram to King Charles III, the new monarch of the United Kingdom.

"Commending her noble soul to the merciful goodness of our Heavenly Father, I assure Your Majesty of my prayers that Almighty God will sustain you with his unending grace as you now take up your high responsibilities as King," the Pope wrote. "Upon you and all who cherish the memory of your late mother, I invoke an abundance of divine blessings as a pledge of comfort and strength in the Lord."

"Eternal rest grant unto her, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her. May she rest in peace. Amen."
