## BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS.

"Are you hiding anything?" It's an uncomfortable question that probably invites a heated denial from most of us; yet most of us are probably hiding something. We might be trying to shrug off a nagging guilt or an unforgiving sin. We might be trying to forget an episode in our lives where we behaved unwisely. We might be trying to cover up the agony of a failed relationship or putting a brave face on a lifetime of loneliness and rejection. How many of us are covering up weaknesses and flaws in our character? Most of us are trying to hide something, yet we would all acknowledge that burying something isn't the best way to find healing or improvement.

The woman at the well in today's gospel was struggling through life with a great deal of baggage. Firstly she was a woman with a lesser role in society, not only that, but a woman without a husband and to add insult to injury, a woman with a bad reputation. Secondly the woman was a Samaritan, a foreigner, and as such, regarded by most as a person to be avoided altogether. Jesus puzzles the woman. He is a man and he is a Jew, in other words, the very last person she would have expected to strike up a conversation. Life had taught the woman to expect something very different. Life had taught her to expect contempt and rejection. Is this why we keep our own failings under

wraps? Do we, like the Samaritan woman expect our friends family and work mates to be unforgiving and uncompromising if they new the real us? God's love is like a sprinkler system spreading Christ's unconditional life giving water without prejudice or judgement. Lent is the time to unravel all our hidden pain and set it before God. Lent is the time to take a leaf out of Jesus' book, to see the pain in the lives of others and break down the barriers society has built.

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Entrance Antiphon:

Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

CORONAVIRUS

As the government has now entered the "delay" phase of its four-step plan to tackle the spread of coronaviras anyone with a new continuous cough or a high temperature above 37.8C should self-isolate for seven days. To help in the disruption of the virus <u>Please</u> wash hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or use alcohol hand gel. There will be <u>NO</u> physical exchange of the Sign of Peace and we need to suspend distribution of Holy Communion under both kinds (the host to be given on the hand only). Water stoups have been emptied for the time being and all hymn books have been taken away. Anyone with cold or flu symptoms to refrain from attending mass or Liturgy of any kind including the sacrament of reconciliation.

Once again we shall continue to monitor the situation both nationally and locally very carefully and pass on any information we receive as soon as possible. Our Lady of Walsingham...Pray for us.

During this Holy Season we shall have a number of extra Masses, devotions and activities to help us focus our hearts and minds on the Passion and Death of Christ. There will be Adoration during Confessions each Saturday during Lent.
