Ask And It Will Be Given

How do we feel about prayer? Some people would answer that they have great faith in prayer and pray all the time. Others would say that they feel prayer is a naive kind of activity, that it doesn't really work and so they don't do it or pray only very briefly. Some of us will consider prayer as a last option. If there are other options, we will most likely pick those first. Our downfall is probably that our approach to prayer is all wrong. We approach God with a kind of shopping list of all the things we feel we need. We approach God with prayers that are foolish, imagining that he might help our football team in the dying moments of a match, or somehow rig our lottery numbers! Worse, we try to bargain with God, promising that we will go to church more often if only he will sort out our problems.

"Ask and it will be given you; search and you will find; knock and the door will be opened for you..." It would be wonderful to believe these words, but before we believe them, we really need to understand

them. It's clear that we need to know what to pray for and how to pray.

Today Jesus gives us a prayer "The Lord's Prayer". But he isn't just giving us a prayer to recite. What he is giving us is a model on which to base our own prayers. In the Lord's Prayer we are invited to pray to God as our Father, acknowledging his holiness and praying with the shared commitment to have his will done on earth. We are invited to pray for our 'daily bread' the things we genuinely need. We must pray for forgiveness and promise to forgive others. Importantly we must pray with persistence, often and throughout the day, not in the way a child would pester a parent, but because only by being persistent will we build a relationship with God. Lastly, we should approach God with the faith we approach a loving parent. Even parents with very average parenting skills know how to give children what they need. "How much more," says Jesus, "will the father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask...."

SUMMER HOLIDAY FOODBANK <u>Donate mindfully</u>

The school holidays are a wonderful time for the children, but for parents struggling to make ends meet it can be an additional anxiety. For those of us with a little bit of extra income, this is a good time to donate to your local foodbank. Donating food and toiletries may sound obvious but giving some thought to what you donate is equally important. At this time we have been specifically asked for tinned/dried custard, rice pudding, tinned vegetables carrots, sweetcorn, peas, jam, pasta sauces, coffee toiletries - shampoo, conditioner, razors/shaving gel. With what the organisers already have in store, the aim is to provide three days of balanced, nutritional meals for those who need a parcel. Keep in mind that some items are stored for long periods, so check use-by dates. Donations can be made via 'Jim's Box' in the narthex at St. Joseph's or via the box in the narthex at Holy Family.
