Standing Up to Herod

Along the mantelpiece our Christmas cards depict angels and shepherds and the Baby Jesus surrounded by the love of his family. Today however we are given a picture of the Holy Family fleeing to safety from a ruthless and murderous dictator.

Herod, realising the wise men had tricked him was infuriated, and commanded that all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under should be killed. In a dream an angel appears to Joseph, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there, for Herod is about to search for the child to destroy him." It is difficult to imagine anyone as cruel or as wicked as Herod. It is hard to imagine anyone so insanely jealous that they could put innocent babies to death. In the context of the 'Feast of the Holy Family' we have to admire how promptly Joseph responded to the angel's message and how well he protects his family from the formidable Herod. In the wider context perhaps the main point of the story is that no amount of wickedness or evil could sabotage God's plan. All over the globe people suffer tragedy and loss and terrible injustice, yet still they somehow manage to retain their faith in God. This has to be testimony to the presence of God in our lives, and testimony to the spirit in each of us that abhors evil.

A lot is spoken nowadays of family values, but sadly those values can often be more about becoming successful and making lots of money than becoming good people. The Holy Family reminds us that real family values are about standing up to the 'Herods' in our world and creating a culture of justice and love. Evil only exists if we allow it.
