Travelling Light

We only need to check the spam in our emails or listen to our answer phones to understand the constant worldly pressures in our lives. Unless you've managed to blank all those nuisance calls, it's more likely that your answer phone will be filled with adverts for injury claims, insurance refunds and pension plans than calls from friends. Whilst commercialism grows louder and louder, the Christian message seems quieter and less popular. We think that 'good' might speak for itself, but it seems that Jesus' teaching needs promoting now more than ever. For this purpose Jesus gives us some practical advice. "Travel light" Jesus tells his missionaries, "no purse, no bag, no sandals," It seems austere advice for missionaries about to embark on an arduous journey, but it makes sense. The less the missionaries had to worry about, the more focussed they would be on the task in hand. The same goes for us tenfold. Think how much our worldly concerns slow us down. We might have some inspirational life changing ideas with which to change the world, but first we have to fix the washing machine, have

have some inspirational life changing ideas with which to change the world, but first we have to fix the washing machine, pay the mortgage, fill in a tax return, vacuum the car and bath the dog. The life changing ideas will just have to wait until tomorrow and tomorrow. Travelling light goes deeper. Jesus knows how much importance we humans attach to possessions. Jesus knows how easy it is for our possessions to possess us! Do we work to live or live to work? Is the house a roof over our head while we live, or do we live to pay the mortgage? Does the car get us to work in the morning, or do we go to work to pay for the car?

Jesus' second strategy is to stay with those who extend a welcome but not to entertain a town that does not offer a welcome. Today we would call it knowing our audience. We have to know when to promote Jesus' teaching, but we also have to know when the time or the situation is not right.

This gospel speaks to us all and that isn't a comfortable thought. Perhaps we've never imagined ourselves as evangelists. Unlike the evangelists in this story, we have no special powers to cast out evil, but we all have the power to spread goodness and kindness. We might feel small in the face of impacting our beliefs on an unbelieving world, but we've huge advantages over those first missionaries who had to evangelise in completely unchartered territory. Working with small numbers in a hostile climate without the modern advantages of computers or television, those early missionaries spread a message that exists two thousand years later. How much easier it ought to be for each of us today.
