### The Word

We're still in the season of Christmas, and today the Church invites us to slow down and look again at what has really happened. We're not at the crib anymore; instead, we're listening to John, who doesn't tell us about shepherds or angels, but about the *Word*.

"The Word was made flesh and lived among us." That's a sentence we've heard so often that it can whoosh straight over our heads. But it's worth thinking about what that actually means. God didn't shout at humanity from a great distance or send instructions from heaven. God came close — close enough to share our ordinary lives, our joys and our struggles, our confusion and our hope. That's important. Because the Word was made flesh and lived among us, we can be confident that God knows our lives inside out.

John reminds us that Jesus is light, and that light shines into the dark corners of our lives. It's a light that guides us in the right direction if we allow it. It's a light that reveals truth and meaning for anyone who cares to look hard enough for it.

This Gospel also speaks about welcome. Some recognised Jesus and received him; others didn't. Today we are invited to answer the question, do we welcome God into our lives? Are we open enough to notice?

As the Christmas season continues, this Sunday reminds us that Christmas isn't a long-ago event in a faraway stable, God is still with us, still present, still speaking, still offering us guidance and life.

God reaches out far and wide to announce the birth of his Son. He reaches out to simple shepherds in the fields around Bethlehem, and to great intellectuals from the East. The story of the Magi, who followed the star and sidestepped the evil Herod, is tempting in its appeal to romanticise, but if we are to learn anything, we have to focus on the nature of God's revelation. Most of us get through life relying on the knowledge we already have. Today's challenge is to look for something new. Knowing where to look for our own guiding star is up to us, but one thing is for sure: if we are not looking for revelation, we will never find it.
